


Know your LIMITS



Lake Winnibigoshish and its connecting waters have slot and possession limits. Below are some details on Lake Winnie's limits and slots, but please familiarize yourself with all Minnesota fishing regulations.

All fishermen over the age of 16 must have a valid Minnesota fishing license. For more information, please visit www.dnr.state.mn.us/

WALLEYE

Possession Limit: 6 fish total in possession limit, with no more than 1 over 23"

SLOT: 18"- 23" IMMEDIATE RELEASE

NORTHERN PIKE

Possession Limit: 10 fish total, no more than 2 over 26" in possession limit

SLOT: 22"- 26" IMMEDIATE RELEASE

MUSKELLUNGE

Possession Limit: 1 combined total (min. size 54")

PERCH

Daily/Possession Limit:
20 fish daily, 40 fish total in possession limit

SUNFISH

Possession Limit: 10 fish total

Cutfoot Sioux Lake has a special fishing regulation for sunfish. This applies to Cutfoot Sioux Lake and connected waters of Little Cutfoot Sioux Lake, First River Flowage, and Egg Lake.

CRAPPIE

Possession Limit: 10 fish total

More about WALLEYE LIMITS

Q: If I catch my limit in the morning, can I eat some for lunch and fish again the same day?

A: No, the 6-fish limit is daily and possession, meaning you would be OVER your limit if you ate part of your limit at lunch, then caught or kept more walleyes in the afternoon.

Q: If I have my 6-fish limit in the boat, can I keep fishing while practicing catch and release?

A: No, if you have your limit in the livewell and land another walleye, that walleye would put you over the daily and possession limit.

Q: If I have a limit of 6 fish in the freezer to bring home, can I keep fishing for walleye?

A: No, the 6 fish in your freezer is your daily and possession limit, therefore you cannot keep fishing for walleye.
